The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically.



Students prepared to enter Kindergarten.


Fluent readers by Third Grade.

Students will be academically and culturally literate by mastering, applying, questioning and defending (the solution) core concepts and experiences.





Students need more time in class - not less.

- Creation of Master Schedule that protects core academic time.
- ➤ Accountability process to ensure students are in their seats on time- ready to learn.

Support & Structure



Student need structured support system centered on Academic Goals.

- ➤ Partnership with community based organization to mutually support parents and students.
- ➤ Creation of rigorous academic goals that are easily understood and disseminated.

Real World Experience



Students need real world examples and experiences to support learning.

- ➤ Partnerships with local organizations to support development of work force skills and habits.
- Field trips centered on educational goals and outcomes.

Reading Intervention Program

- ➤ Allocate funding from Pre-K 3 grant to fund half-day reading intervention teacher.
- ➤ Reallocation of current staff to assist with reading intervention programs.
- > Creation of Marin City Reads Program Volunteer reading support program targeting Marin City residents to enrich reading program.

Creation of Backward curriculum map focused on college or career readiness.


