5. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Because the Board has a responsibility to conduct district business in an orderly and efficient way, the following procedures shall regulate public presentations to the Board. The Board is asking that members of the public wishing to speak, fill out a form located on the counter/table, stating their name and address; the agenda item; and the topic to be discussed. BB 9323.

The Governing Board is prohibited from taking any action on any item raised in this section unless the item is specifically agendaized. The members of the Governing Board may ask a question for clarification, provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, request staff to report back at a subsequent meeting on any matter or take action directing staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. Governing Board members may make brief announcements or briefly report on his/her own activities as they relate to school business.

State open meeting laws allow members of the public to lodge public criticism of District policies, procedures, programs, or services. However, those same laws include specific provisions designed to protect the liberty and reputational interests of public employees by providing for the non-public hearing of complaints or charges against employees of the District. Under these laws, it is the employee subject to complaints or charges who is provided the right to choose whether those complaints or charges will be heard in open or closed session. It is therefore the desire of the Sausalito Marin City School District that complaints against an employee be put in writing, and that when the Board hears complaints or charges against an employee it do so in closed session unless the employee requests an open session. Consistent with the law and the opinion of the State Attorney General's Office, please submit any complaints against an employee in writing, to the administration, in accordance with the district's complaint procedure. This procedure is designed to allow the District to address complaints against employees while at the same time respecting their legitimate privacy rights and expectations.

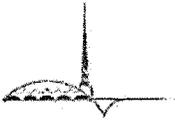

2015-16 Web Transparency Report Card Bringing Marin County's Local Governments to Light

SUMMARY

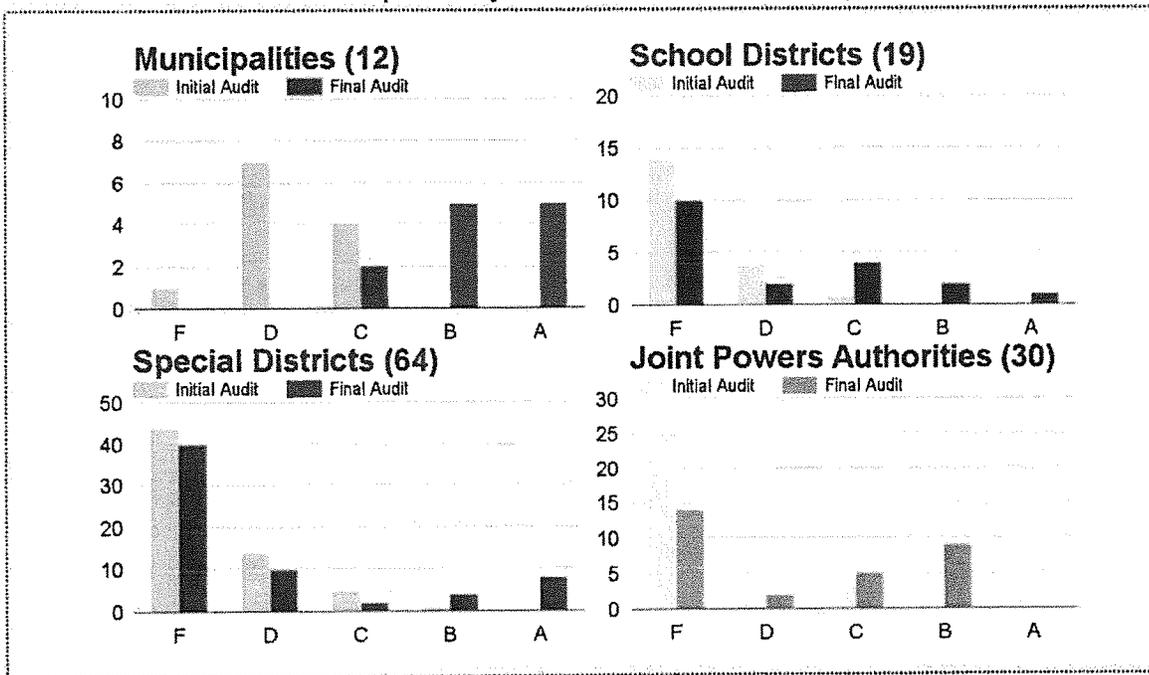
How important are government websites? In April 2015, the Pew Research Center reported¹ that "65% of Americans in the prior 12 months have used the internet to find data or information pertaining to government". Between October 2015 and January 2016, the Marin County Civil Grand Jury audited local government agencies' websites to evaluate the quality of online information such as budgets, audits and board member information. We found serious deficiencies. The Grand Jury provided each agency with our preliminary audits and described our approach. All agencies were offered the opportunity to improve their websites for a final audit. Many websites significantly improved, while others remained deficient. This audit report provides transparency improvement recommendations for Marin local agency websites.

126 local agencies were audited: 12 municipalities, 19 school districts, 64 special districts, 30 joint powers authorities (JPAs), and 1 rail district.

59 local agencies improved their websites, and 34 received a grade of B- or better.

27 local agencies have no website: 19 special districts and 8 joint powers authorities (JPAs).

March 8, 2016**

ATTENDANCE

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m.

CLOSED SESSION

The Board and Superintendent convened closed session at 5:31 p.m.

RECONVENE TO OPEN SESSION

Open session reconvened at 6:17 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Trustee Ziegler led the Pledge of Allegiance.

REPORT OUT OF CLOSED SESSION

Trustee Van Alst announced that no action was taken in closed session.

AGENDA ORDER

The agenda order was approved.

BOARD COMMUNICATIONS

Trustee Barrow said that he attended a meeting at the Marin County Office of Education with trustee Van Alst to discuss ways in which MCOE could assist our district. He also attended the WestEd- facilitated Local Control and Accountability Plan meeting at Bayside MLK Jr. Academy and was concerned that only one parent was there. We need a different strategy to engage parents in the process, he said.

Superintendent Ferguson said his perception is that parents are less involved because they have been disappointed in the past, or because a particular crisis has been resolved. He suggested using the web-based program Survey Monkey to gather community input.

Trustee Barrow said that he went to the Willow Creek Academy board meeting. He reported that unlike in previous years, the charter school is not setting class sizes, so it can continue to get applicants and maximize in-district participation.

Trustee Barrow reported that he has accepted a project management position at the Marin City Community Development Corporation.

Trustee Newmeyer said he also attended the WestEd meeting and found it informative.

Trustee Van Alst said that she recently toured the campus of Bayside MLK Jr. Academy and sat in on a parent meeting. The walk to school program has been a great success, she reported. She hoped to have another LCAP meeting scheduled for 8 a.m. so more parents can attend right after they drop their children.

Trustee Van Alst noted that the March 8, 2016 board packet showed the cost of the District's 2014-2015 audit to be \$167,500. This was an error; the correct amount is \$17,500.

2014-15 District Audit

Mr. Stephen Roatch of Stephen Roatch Accountancy said that there were no major findings in the audit; this is the best kind of report possible, he told the board. Board members then asked for clarification on several audit items.

Marin City Health & Wellness Center

Jayvon Muhammad, CEO of the Marin City Health & Wellness Center said the clinic is a federally qualified center that provides medical, dental and mental health services to southern Marin and San Francisco. It was founded by leaders in Marin City and focuses heavily on this community. She continued: We have lots of natural partnerships with the school, such as medical and dental screenings for all students. In addition, behavioral health teams also work with students at both Bayside MLK Jr. Academy and Willow Creek. We also have a partnership with the Conscious Kitchen cafeteria program to bring over seniors to share lunch with the kids at Bayside MLK. This is a beneficial program for the seniors as well as the kids; our patients love eating with the children. We have two other preventative mental health programs at our Center, one is Girl Power and the other is the Defenders. She then introduced the leader of the Defenders program.

Zared Lloyd, facilitator for the Defenders program, said that many of the children in this district come from single-parent families and have difficulty in coping with absent fathers. These problems affect their academic and social lives. He continued: Our program aims to help middle schoolers cope with those issues. We emphasize brotherhood and a sense of community, where we look out for one another. This allows the problems to be discussed out in the open and for the wounds to be healed. When the program started, we had 10-15 boys, now we have 45. I am available 7 days a week 24 hours a day. I teach our kids leadership, communication skills, how to dress and business skills. I teach them other ways out of their predicament than the NFL or the NBA, I tell them that there is more than one way out. There are no requirements to join the Defenders, but members must keep up academically and behave well to stay. In the summer, we take the Defenders on a countrywide road trip, visiting 28 states in 30 days. The trip encourages members to momentarily forget their own circumstances and see how others live, both those who are better off and kids who are less well off. I encourage our members to look at all that we have in common.

Asked about his own background, Mr. Lloyd said: I have always been an advocate for change. At 16, I worked in construction and learned a great deal. I am thankful for the opportunities I have had and want to share my knowledge by being an example to the younger generation.

Joshua, a 14- year old member of the Defenders, said that the club has changed his life completely. I have been more responsible in the house and in my life in general. This program teaches you entrepreneurship and so much more. I just love being a Defender, he told the board.

Ms. Muhammad said that this program is partly funded through a small grant from the Marin county Health and Human Services department. The clinic also does fundraising to cover the cost of the summer trip.

Pre K- 3 Grant

Principal Jonnette Newton said that the Pre K-3 team will give a report on the Pre K-3 initiative, which began six years ago with the goal of closing the readiness gap between pre-school and kindergarten. Teachers are also focusing on having every third grader read at level; studies show that if they can read at level by third grade, they will be successful through high school.

She thanked the Marin Community Foundation for the grant and for their patience. The team includes pre-kindergarten, transitional kindergarten and kindergarten teachers, as well as instructors from the Marin Learning Center, Manzanita Head Start and Bridge the Gap.

Looking to next year, our data committee analyzed all the available data to come up with goals for next year, she said. They will work with the LCAP advisory team so that the adopted goals can be incorporated into the budget.

Carol Burns, Pre K-3 facilitator, said one big opportunity was to work with a research group from North Carolina to develop a culture of collaborative inquiry. A difficult transition is to get away from the 1950s style “carrots and sticks” method of changing behavior and work with motivation theory to help kids make own choices and self regulate by giving them some extra leeway. Each classroom was observed and teachers received the data to see and understand a student’s experience in the classroom during an entire day.

Barbara Gould, supervisor with Head Start and a member of the design team, said that she has been working with third/fourth grade teacher Jim Scullion on cultural proficiency. We look at our own beliefs and biases to ensure that we create an equitable experience for students regardless of race and income, she told the board. The country’s “white” culture has created an environment of inequity; to effect change we must look deeply at our own practice.

Trustee Barrow said that he would like more information about outcomes. After 5-6 years, it seems that the needle has not moved, he said. Ms. Burns said that looking at the data, it is clear that kids are getting big bounds in language acquisition from kindergarten to first grade. Teachers are making changes in their methods and we hope to see better results next year, she said. Ms. Gould added that it takes some time for fundamental change to occur. Many things are coming together this year and I see great hope for the future, she concluded.

At 7:56 pm, the board took a 5 minute recess.

The board reconvened at 8:03 pm.

District 2015-2016 Second Interim Budget Report

Chief Business Official Paula Rigney presented a slide show of the budget report. She said that the special education encroachment into the general fund continues to be problem; it currently stands at \$1.2 million.

Trustee Ziegler said we have to think outside the box to come up with a solution to this problem. Trustee Barrow said we need additional eyes on the budget so we can have confidence in our direction for the future. Trustee Van Alst asked about the administration of special education and was informed that Susan Martin is the director of the district’s program.

Looking ahead, our budget challenges will be funding Willow Creek Academy, special education and setting money aside for deferred maintenance and technology, Ms. Rigney said. Trustee Barrow said we should discuss fundraising and see whether nearby technology companies can help us with our IT needs.

Marilyn Mackel, a community member and volunteer, said the board should think about tackling its challenges differently. It is outrageous that the board is not thinking about the quality of persons hired who could bring additional revenues to the district. It is important to have a superintendent who can write grant proposals. Every organization recognizes that grants expire and that they must look for alternatives. In setting up a budget, it is logical to start from needs, and then find the money to answer those needs, she said.

Gayle Henrickson, a community member, said it is clear that the district is struggling with core, mandatory expenditures. She continued: The community is very hopeful that change is coming. We have two schools where 80% are performing below standard. I am confident that with the passion and expertise and competence that is here, we can change this statistic. We are all in this for the kids, so we have to have a positive attitude.

Trustee Barrow said that Ms. Mackel's remarks resonated with him. We should think about the programs that we want and need. We lack a multi-year, program driven process. We need to approach budgeting differently. Trustee Van Alst said that she hopes LCAP will take us in that direction.

Willow Creek Report

Head of School Royce Conner said that his school uses a test called Measures of Academic Process. MAP is an online adaptive test, tailored to individual students. It is a tool to answer that important parental question: what did my child learn this year? He then showed a slide report of students' results.

Willow Creek Academy 2015-2016 Second Interim Budget Report

Clark Warden said that total revenues have not changed significantly, while expenditures are down by about \$87K. Total fund balance at the end of the first interim budget was \$17K; currently it is \$99K.

Superintendent

Superintendent Ferguson invited Dr. Walt Buster to speak to the board. Dr. Buster said that he was happy to offer his services as a facilitator and workshop leader to design an in-service program for the board. He suggested that a sub-committee be set up to come up with specific suggestions. Trustees Barrow and Newmeyer volunteered to be on the sub-committee.

SMCTA Negotiations

Mr. Ferguson said that he has received a request to start a sunshine process for negotiations with teachers.

Discussion of Superintendent Position

The board decided to hear a discussion on the search for a superintendent at a future meeting.

WestEd – LCAP Procedure

Mr. Ferguson said that a schedule has been set up for the meetings that will involve the community in the LCAP procedure.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) for 2016-2017

The board heard that Community Action Marin will not run the transitional kindergarten program going forward. Mr. Ferguson said that this issue will be brought back for discussion in April.

Resolution 725 – Agreement with Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS)

Superintendent Ferguson said that an early retirement agreement for some teachers will result in substantial savings for the district.

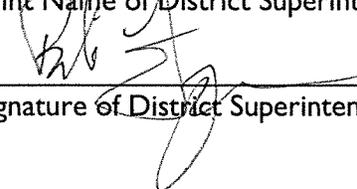

Item: Resolution #726 - Budget Transfers to Permit Payment Obligations during Fiscal Year and at Close of Year

Background:

The current fiscal year ends June 30, 2016. Staff will be closing the accounting for this fiscal year, and some adjustments may be necessary to ensure that all funds and categorical accounts end with positive balances. Also, during the course of the year temporary transferring to another fund or account may need to be made in order to meet payment obligations. This temporary transfer of funds will be accounted for as temporary borrowing between funds and will not be available for appropriation or be considered revenue to the borrowing fund or account. Amounts transferred must be repaid either in the same fiscal year or in the following fiscal year if the transfer occurs within the final 120 calendar days of a fiscal year. State law allows a Board of Trustees to authorize its staff, by adoption of a resolution, to submit transfers within the budget to the County Superintendent of Schools as part of the budget process and closing of the fiscal year accounts. Such authorization does not authorize staff to change the total amounts budgeted, but it does authorize the redistribution of budget amounts between accounts. The amounts involved are generally small.

The resolution and this process are routine, and this resolution and authorization are typically requested each year as part of the budgeting process and closing of the budget year. This authorization will simplify the budget process and closing of the books for 2015-2016.

Fiscal Impact:

There will be an indeterminate fiscal impact of this authorization, since the exact magnitude of transfers is not known at this time. It is not anticipated that the fiscal impact will be significant, since most transfers will be between budget expenditures accounts without changing the overall amount of the 2015-2016 budget.

BUDGET TRANSFERS OF FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Sausalito Marin City School District has determined that there may be insufficient cash to meet current obligations; and

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 42603 permits the Governing Board of any school district to direct that monies held in any fund or account may be temporarily transferred to another fund or account of the district for payment of obligations. The transfer shall be accounted for as temporary borrowing between funds and shall not be available for appropriation or be considered income to the borrowing fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with Education Code Section 42603, monies may be transferred between funds of the district and repaid in accordance with Education Code Section 42603.

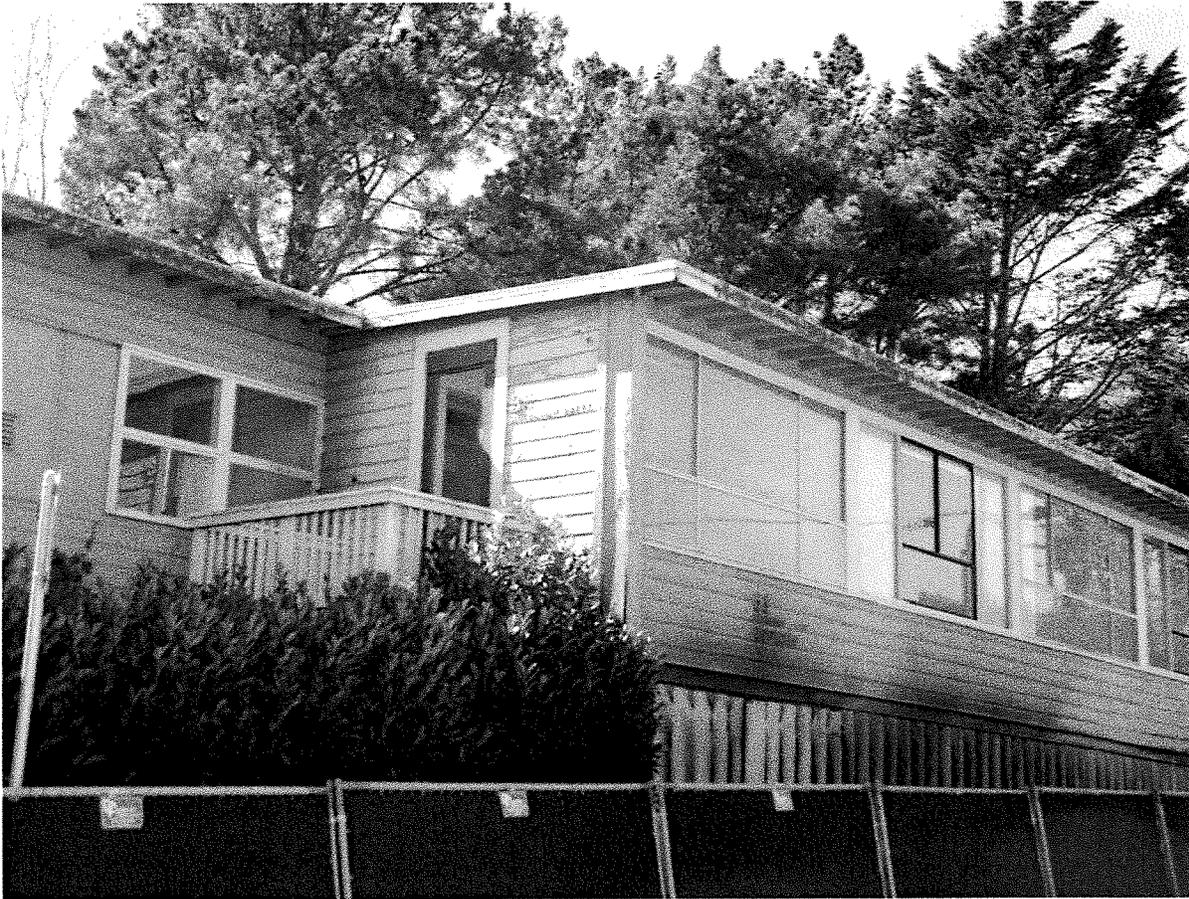

BACKGROUND

During the first week of September, the District Office for the Sausalito Marin City School District, located at 33 Buchanan Drive in Sausalito, was substantially damaged by fire. The District has vacated the building and currently it is fenced off and not in use. On September 10, 2015 the District hired Peoples Associates Structural Engineers and Artik Art & Architecture to evaluate the damage to the building and make recommendations regarding the feasibility of rebuilding the building versus demolition and replacement.

The building located at 33 Buchanan is an approximately 5,000 square foot, one-story wood framed structure built into the hill below Willow Creek Academy. The building is elevated on posts such that there is a roughly 1,000 square foot partial lower level accessible from Buchanan that was being used as a shop and storage for the Maintenance department. It has a low sloped roof, wood siding, and wood panels enclosing the partial basement and crawlspace.



SITE VISIT

The fire reportedly began at the basement level near the center of the building, spread across the second floor framing, and up through the upper level, and through the roof. During the site visit, we observed extensive damage to the floor structure the center of the building, with some areas of complete burn through near the center hallway. Some areas of the roof structure were also observed to be heavily damaged in this area.



On the second floor, there were multiple indications that the fire was in the stud space of the walls, including some areas of burn through and smoke damage around electrical outlets. Many interior windows and skylights were broken and extensive water damage was evident across the building. There was a pervasive smell of smoke indicating that floor, wall and ceiling finish materials had absorbed a significant amount of smoke. Where walls had been burned through, or opened by the fire fighters, electrical and low voltage cabling was observed to be melted.



Walking through the basement, it was clear that the fire had spread horizontally in the workshop/crawlspace. Some of the floor joists were burned through, while others were substantially blackened and charcoaled. Under floor wiring had melted away and underfloor duct systems were either burned or collapsed after supports burned through.



From the exterior, there is surprising little indication of the fire from the south, east and west sides, but on the north side (up the hill), the entry patio has collapsed due to burn damage, several of the foundation wood panels have burned out, and smoke and fire damage on the building exterior is evident.



Architectural Systems

The damage to the exterior enclosure from the fire is most prominent on the north side of the building. However, the exterior wood siding on the other sides of the building is showing dry rot and deterioration from the marine environment. A substantial amount of the roofing was damaged due to the burn through at the roof structure.

Structural Systems

The subject building is a one-story structure built on the side of a hill with a large crawl space of varying height, constructed circa 1950. The roof, walls and floor are conventionally wood framed consistent with the era of construction. The foundation system is a combination of concrete drilled piers and continuous spread footings.

The majority of the fire damage was located in the center portion and north side of the building. Approximately 1/3 of the existing roof and floor structural members were damage by the fire and will need to be repaired or replaced.

The interior finishes in the area of the burn are completely destroyed. In other areas, water damage and smoke damage is widespread.

Mechanical Systems

A complete review of the mechanical system is beyond the scope of this report, but it appears that the building was heated by a furnace located in the crawlspace, with distribution through underfloor ducts. The furnace was substantially damaged, as were the distribution ducts.

Electrical Systems

A complete review of the electrical system is beyond the scope of this report, but it appears the main panel was substantially damaged in the fire. The panel is of an older type and it was observed that most of the electrical outlets are not grounded per current code. In addition, the use of Romex distribution was observed in some of open ceiling areas – Romex is not allowed by code to be used in commercial buildings.

REGULATORY ISSUES

Typically, buildings on public school campuses are regulated by the Division of the State Architect (DSA) under the Field Act. However, preliminary discussions with DSA have indicated that DSA has no record of the construction of this building under their jurisdiction, and it is possible it was constructed prior to the site becoming a public school site. As far as DSA is concerned, this is a “non-school building” and has been appropriately fenced off from the rest of the campus. It is possible that a “non-school building” can act as a District Office (since it is not regularly used by students or teachers), and in such case, it would go through the local building department for plan check.

In preliminary discussions with Mr. Kenneth Henry, Building Inspector with the City of Sausalito, Mr. Henry indicated that it is possible that at least a seismic upgrade would be required for the reconstruction of the building, if not a current code compliant gravity and lateral load resisting system. At the time of writing of this report Mr. Henry was still researching the issue.

In our research, the following provision in the Existing Buildings Code that may be applicable to the situation at the SMCSO District Office: Section 3417.2 states:

“For existing state owned structures the requirements of Section 3417 [seismic upgrade requirements] apply whenever the structure is to be retrofitted, repaired or modified and any of the following apply:

1. Total construction cost, not including the cost of furnishings, fixtures and equipment, or normal maintenance, for the building exceeds 25 percent of the construction cost for the replacement of the existing building”

Since the repair costs will easily exceed 25% of the replacement cost, this would appear to require, at a minimum, a seismic structural retrofit per Section 3417 will be required.

In addition, the City of Sausalito Ordinance No. 1203 requires that buildings undergoing “substantial remodel” be fitted with a fully automatic fire sprinkler system. While this requirement may be excepted by the Fire Code Official, for the purposes of this report, we are assuming no such exception.

RECONSTRUCTION RECOMMENDATIONS

Architectural, Mechanical and Electrical Systems

As noted above, there was substantial damage to the exterior enclosure of the building on the north side. For the other sides of the building, there was no visible fire damage, but weather damage was visible. Also as noted above, the windows that were not fire damaged, show substantial weather damage and were reportedly leaking air and water, even before the fire. The roofing also would require replacement. The advantage of these replacements would be markedly lowered energy usage. While a complete energy analysis is beyond the scope of this report, and current code compliant building envelope has been generally seen to use at least 40% less energy than a noncompliant one.

- *Therefore it is recommended to remove and replace the exterior lap siding on the entire building with insulation, a vapor retarder and new lap siding. It is also recommended to replace all the window system with new dual glazed, low E window systems, and the roofing with a Cool Roof compliant single ply roofing system, with insulation above and below the roof deck.*

As noted above, the mechanical and electrical systems of the building were substantially damaged in the fire, and would require a total replacement with code compliant systems. In order to install these systems, as well as for structural upgrades, and the need to visually verify any additional damage hidden behind the walls, all the interior finishes in all the rooms should be removed and replaced. This would also be recommended as the smell of the smoke has inundated the finishes, and would likely remain even if the original finishes materials were painted or otherwise encapsulated.

- *Therefore it is recommended to remove and replace all wall, ceiling and floor finishes with new.*
- *A new gas-fired forced air mechanical system with insulated ducts should be provided.*
- *A new main electrical panel and switchboard, and a grounded distribution system in EMC conduit should be provided.*
- *New lighting systems with LED fixtures should be provided.*
- *A new data and communications can also be provided in the walls.*

Accessibility Upgrades

In addition to the above, the code requires upgrades for the purposes of accessibility to persons with disabilities, per Chapter 11b of the California Building Code. In the case of the District Office, this would include an elevator to move between levels, ramps at two of the exit doors to provide accessible exit routes, code compliant hardware, signage, etc.

- *Provide a new elevator system, two new ramp systems, and miscellaneous accessible features.*

Structural Systems

Given the extent of fire damage it is recommended that all finishes be removed so that the damage to all structural members can be observed. We estimate that approximate 1/3 of the roof and floor structural members will need to be replaced or repaired to be able to resist current code applied forces.

Additionally, according to the regulatory issues, it is likely that a full seismic upgrade to the building will be required. The buildings existing lateral force resisting systems is severely lacking and would require extensive retrofits to the wood framed structure as well as the foundations in order to meet current code requirements. An engineering estimate for the repairs and retrofit measures has been developed to help determine the feasibility of reconstructing the subject building.

- *Provide a full seismic upgrade to meet current code requirements.*

Fire Protection Systems

As noted above, the local ordinance requires the addition of a fully automatic fire sprinkler system. This would include tapping a water main in the street, bring a line into the site, providing a backflow preventer assembly, Fire Department Connection, Post Indicator Valve, providing a Riser Assembly, and providing the overhead distribution system.

- *Therefore it is recommended to provide a fully automatic fire sprinkler system.*

RECONSTRUCTION COSTS AND COMPARISON TO REPLACEMENT COSTS

On the basis of the above recommendations, we have provided a conceptual rough order of magnitude (ROM) recommended budget (please see Appendix 1 for detailed cost estimate). We compare that the cost of replacement, including the cost of demolition of the existing structure, construction of a new building of the same square footage, configuration, and use.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above cost analysis, a replacement building would be approximately equal to the cost to the reconstruction cost of the building. Other advantages to a new building would be:

- Longer facility life
- Ability to design a more efficient and useful floor plan
- Opportunity to provide a new image for the District

Given the above information, it is our recommendation that a replacement building be pursued by the District.

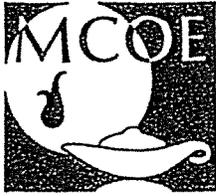

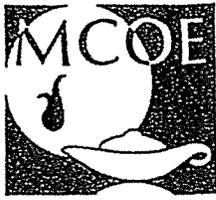

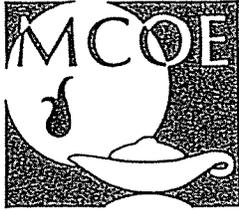
