We write to inform you that a student or staff person in your child's classroom has tested positive for COVID-19. We are working with Marin County Public Health to support contact tracing efforts according to protocols developed jointly with Public Health and the Marin County Office of Education. Based on our investigation, we believe that your child **has NOT** had close contact with the COVID-19-positive individual. Your child may therefore continue with school and their usual daily activities, while monitoring for symptoms.

We are taking all steps required by Public Health to prevent the spread of COVID-19. When a positive COVID Case is identified within our school community, you can expect the following:

- BMLK will receive and follow specific guidance from Marin County Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Division of Public Health. The School provides data to HHS for contact tracing to identify children and staff who have been exposed through school activities to COVID-19
- Watch your child for symptoms of COVID-19. If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 (cough shortness of breath / difficulty breathing loss of taste or smell, fever (100.4°F/38°C or higher) or chills sore throat diarrhea congestion/runny nose), they must be tested for COVID-19 or evaluated by a healthcare provider. If not, they must stay at home and isolate for at least 10 days. If your child tests positive, please contact your school immediately.
